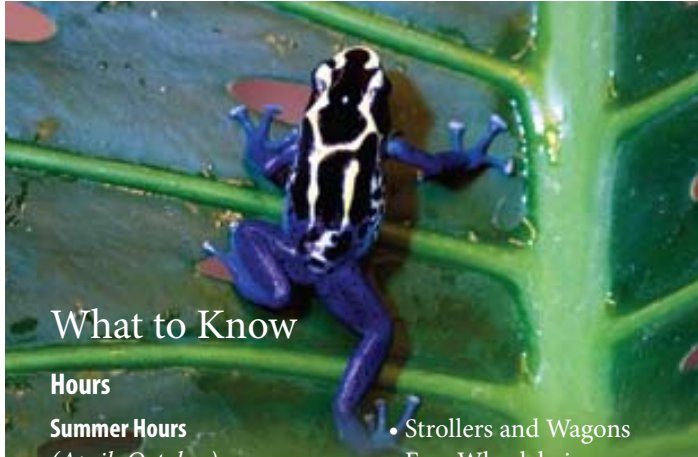

Zoo Highlights

Check out the following exhibits.

Regenstein Center for African Apes **13**

Get face-to-face with Lincoln Park Zoo's famous gorillas and chimpanzees. Three different groups can be seen climbing trees, burrowing in the mulch and interacting with fellow apes in natural indoor and outdoor habitats.

Pritzker Family Children's Zoo **9**

Enjoy a walk in the woods. Visitors of all ages can observe red wolves, black bears, river otters and beavers in a wooded outdoor setting. Indoors, kids can see snakes and insects at eye level before exploring the upper canopy in the Treetop Canopy Climbing Adventure.

Regenstein African Journey **4**

Experience the sights and sounds of Africa. Dwarf crocodiles and pygmy hippos swim in rain forest pools while meerkats and masked lovebirds play in a dry thorn forest. Outdoors, towering giraffes amble in the savanna near neighboring warthogs and African wild dogs.

Farm-in-the-Zoo Presented by John Deere **15**

Kids (and kids at heart) can experience the country without leaving the city. Learn about the origins of the foods we eat, greet the goats in the contact yard, climb aboard a tractor in the Main Barn and visit with cows, sheep, chickens, pigs and ponies.

- 25 **Paddleboats:** Rentals last 30 minutes: \$12 for a four-seater boat or \$16 for a swan boat.
- 26 **LPZOO Children's Train:** Hop aboard this kid-friendly locomotive. \$2 per ride.
- 27 **AT&T Endangered Species Carousel:** Take a ride with your favorite animal. \$2.50 per ride.
- 28 **African Safari Ride:** Encounter the wilds of Africa on this virtual-reality adventure: \$4 members/\$5 non-members.

While the animals are always the focus at Lincoln Park Zoo, a full visit can include so much more.

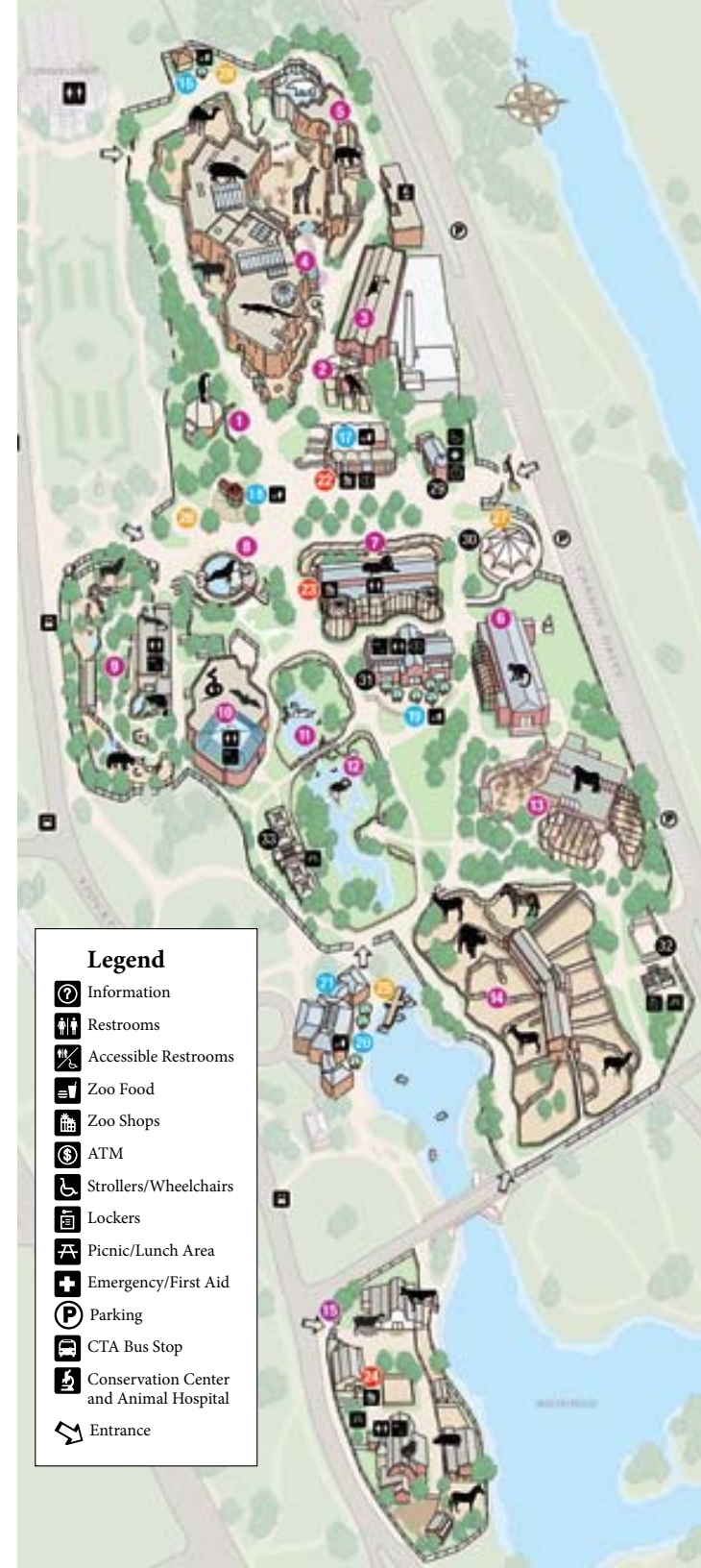
- Take a spin on the AT&T Endangered Species Carousel.
