

10 Rabbit and Butterfly by *H. Wheatley Allen*

Located at Pritzker Family Children's Zoo near the beaver lodge discovery window, this piece features a rabbit and butterfly with a dedication plaque honoring Cheryl Norton Stuart. Donated by James Stuart and unveiled in 1988, it was relocated from the original Children's Zoo in 2006.

11 Seal and Sea Lion* by *Dino C. Crisanti*

Located at Kovler Sea Lion Pool, this life-sized bas-relief of a seal and sea lion provides a visual and tactile teaching tool to compare physical features of the two species. Unveiled in 2002.

12 Lion Fountain by *George Suyeoka*

Located west of the Kovler Lion House along the public path, this piece features a lion pride drinking from a shallow pool that receives water from a drinking spout. Donated by Frank and Mary Vanker, it was unveiled in 2006.

13 Old Fishing Hole* by *Peter Darro*

Located at the Waterfowl Lagoon waterfall, this grizzly bear clutching a fish is one-third life size. Unveiled in 1987, it was relocated from the McCormick Bear Habitat in 2003.

14 Rite of Spring* by *Milton Horn*

Located west of Antelope & Zebra Area, this piece depicts a ram and Pan, god of fields, forests, wild animals, flocks and shepherds in Greek mythology. The terra cotta sculpture, dating from 1952, is mounted on a brick and limestone wall designed for the sculpture. Presented by the Milton Horn Art Trust, it was unveiled in 2004.

15 Gorilla* *Artist unknown*

Located outside Regenstein Center for African Apes facing the zebra habitat, this stylized outline of a gorilla figure is carved into a natural boulder. Unveiled in 1976, it was relocated 2005 with the opening of the new great ape facility.

16 Lowland Gorilla Family by *Bill Wieger*

Located along the entry path to Regenstein Center for African Apes, this piece recreates a lowland-gorilla family at play. Donated by the Robert David London Family, it was unveiled in 2004 and dedicated in 2007.

17 Sunform by *David Rodgers*

Located at the center plaza of the historic Great Lawn south of Park Place Café, this is a modern interpretation of a classical sundial, placed in recognition of The Lincoln Park Zoological Society's 25th anniversary. Donated by CitiCorp, it was repositioned in 1998.

18 Dream Lady by *Edward McCarten*

Located at the northeast side of the Helen Brach Primate House, this piece features two children below an angel and an inscription from a Eugene Fields poem. Donated by schoolchildren and citizens of Chicago, with aid from the Benjamin F. Ferguson Fund. Unveiled in 1922.

19 Bushman's Head* by *C. J. Albrecht*

Located within the office of the curator of primates, this is a life-sized rendering of the head of Bushman, the silverback gorilla in residence at Lincoln Park Zoo from 1930–1951. (Not available for public viewing.)

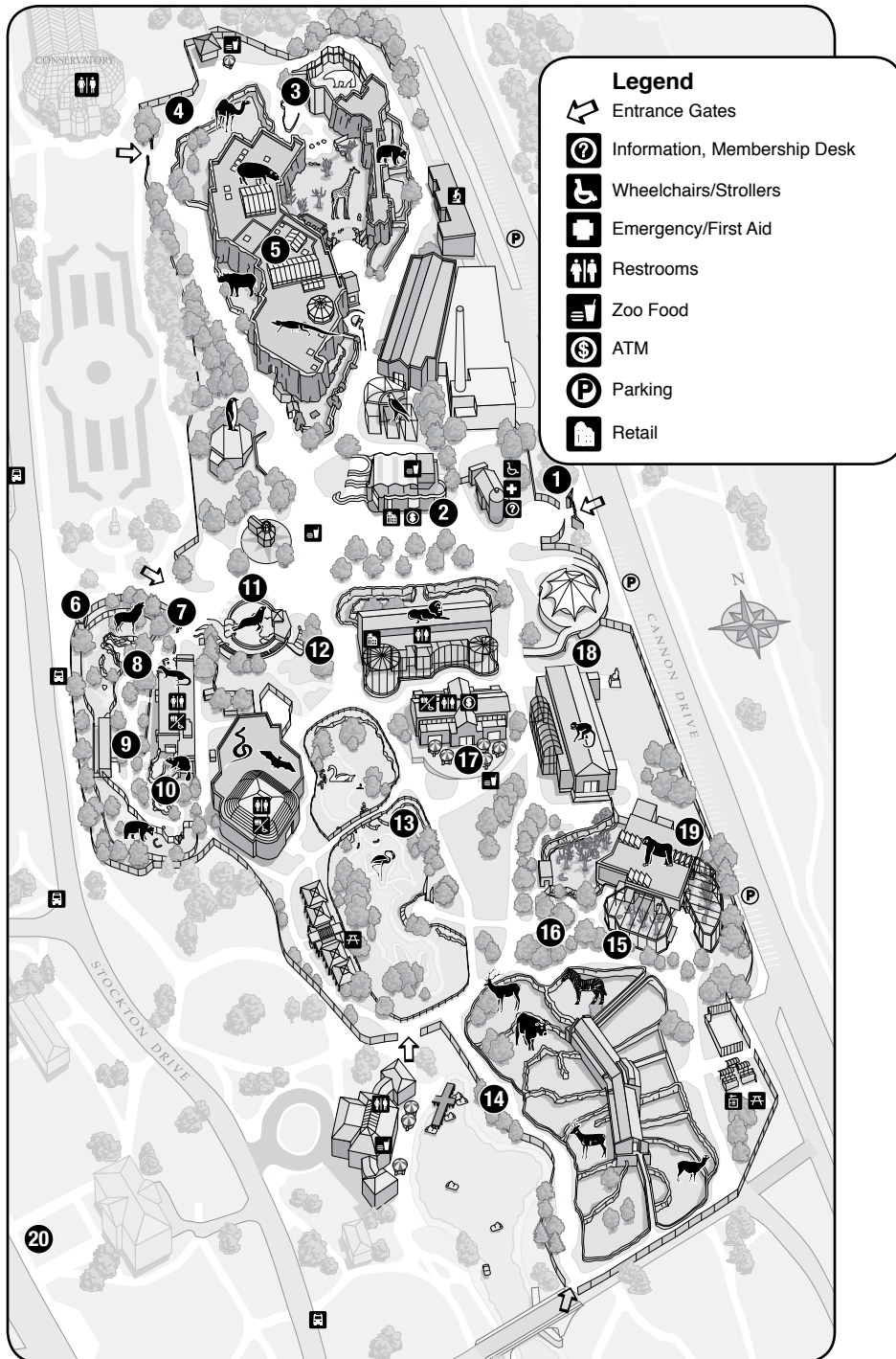
20 Siblings by *Rosetta*

Located west of the Matthew Laflin Memorial Building on Clark Street, the sculpture features two young mountain lions reclining. Donated by Charles C. Haffner III, it was unveiled in 1997.

- 1 East Gate-Lincoln Park Zoo Arch** by *Greg Leavitt and Camille Leavitt*
 Located at Lincoln Park Zoo's East Gate, this installation features a twisting tropical vine supporting a green iguana, colobus monkey, two fruit bats, toucan, boa constrictor and numerous dragonflies. The arched vine springs from rusticated limestone plinths and is book-ended by lion and kudu figures. Donated by The Women's Board of The Lincoln Park Zoological Society, it was unveiled in 2002.
- 2 Limestone Lion** by *Kathleen McCullough*
 Located at the east side of Wild Things! gift shop, this lion is meant to be climbed on. Donated by CitiCorp, the sculpture serves as a memorial to Rush A. Watkins, former director of the Lincoln Park Zoological Society.
- 3 Polar Bear** by *Viktor*
 Located near the Polar Bear Plaza underwater viewing window, this stylized piece displays a polar bear preparing to dive into water. Donated by Stanstead Granite Industry and the artist, it was unveiled in 2008.
- 4 Elephant Drinking Fountain** by *George Suyeoka*
 Located north of Regenstein African Journey near the Conservatory Gate, this fountain is mounted on a bronze podium and features an adult female and infant elephant drinking from a shallow pool that receives water from a drinking spout. Donated by Mr. and Mrs. Matthew Gelbin, it was unveiled in 1992.
- 5 Mother and Baby Pygmy Hippo** by *Mitchell*
 Located inside Regenstein African Journey near the pygmy hippo exhibit, this sculpture features a life-sized mother and young pygmy hippo. Donated by the estate of Mrs. Robert Strauss, it was installed on zoo grounds in 2003, then relocated to Regenstein African Journey in 2006.
- 6 The Lesson*** by *Darrell Davis*
 Located at Lincoln Park Zoo's West Gate, the statue shows an adult female black bear and two cubs appearing to catch fish from a stream. The tableau rests on top of a dressed limestone plinth marking the pedestrian entrance to the west side of the zoo. Unveiled in 2005.
- 7 Pathfinders** by *Veryl Goodnight*
 Located near the Pritzker Family Children's Zoo building entrance, this piece features three North American gray wolves on the move. Donated by Jean McBride Greene, it was unveiled in 2005.
- 8 Heron** by *H. Wheatley Allen*
 Located near the Pritzker Family Children's Zoo building, this elegant piece depicts a life-sized heron. Donated by James Stuart and unveiled in 1988, it was relocated to its current home from the original Children's Zoo in 2006.
- 9 The Fountain for the Young at Heart** by *George Suyeoka*
 Located between the bear and wolf habitats along the outdoor visitor path of Pritzker Family Children's Zoo, this tri-cornered children's drinking fountain has a variety of near-life-sized small animal figures arranged fancifully. Donated by Betty Koenig Greenwald and Sally Koenig, it was originally commissioned for the zoo's first Children's Zoo (1964–2004) and relocated to its new home in 2006.
